Time to Act: Scrimgeour Report Calls for Bold Reform in Kiwifruit Sector

The Māori Horticulture Council (Tāngata Huawhenua) endorses the release of "Pathways to a Better Future for the NZ Kiwifruit Industry" by Professor Frank Scrimgeour, calling it a wake-up call for industry leaders and growers alike.

The report outlines four major strategic opportunities for ensuring grower profitability, sector resilience, and long-term legitimacy — while warning that inaction could lead to loss of trust, reduced returns, and potential regulatory intervention.

"This is the most important report we've seen on the future of our industry in a decade," says Tāngata Huawhenua Chairman Ratahi Cross. "It exposes the cracks — from declining green returns and governance tensions, to offshore growth and shareholder dilution. More importantly, it offers clear, practical pathways forward."

Key recommendations include:

- Establishing a Grower Shareholder Fund to reverse declining grower ownership of Zespri
- Building a transparent framework for offshore growing operations
- Reforming Plant Variety Rights (PVR) to ensure equity and grower benefit
- Overhauling the kiwifruit supply chain to reduce inefficiencies and increase value

The report also calls for attention to Māori inclusion, climate resilience, and the growing voice of new entrants, including Indian growers.

Tangata Huawhenua supports the report's direction and urges sector leaders to work in genuine partnership with Maori to build an industry that is profitable, accountable, and future-ready.
